

Procedure for a provider ceasing to provide a VSL course

ACBC has in place a procedure in the event of ceasing to provide a course

Steps

- 1. ACBC will notify students enrolled in the course, in writing by mail and to their personal email, within 2 days, that the course is no longer being provided;
- 2. ACBC will meet with the affected students within 7 business days after notifying the students, and ACPET, the tuition assurance scheme operator for the course at the campus where the course was primarily delivered;
- 3. ACBC's website will be updated by the IT Manager as soon as practicable, to reflect that the course is no longer being provided and to give tuition assurance information;
- 4. Notify ACPET, the tuition assurance scheme operator, with 24 hours that ACBC ceases to provide the course;
- 5. ACBC shall also provide ACPET the following for each covered student concerned within 3 business days after the provider ceases to provide the course:
 - (a) the student's full name and contact details;
 - (b) the part or parts of the course that the student is enrolled in;
 - (c) the amount of the tuition fees for each part of the course in which the student is enrolled;
 - (d) details about the payment of those tuition fees, including the amounts that are covered fees;
 - (e) a copy of a statement of attainment for the parts of the course the student has completed, issued by the course provider or an authorised issuing organisation in accordance with the Australian Qualifications Framework.
- 6. ACBC will re-credit the student's FEE-HELP balance as soon as practicable, after receiving notice from ACPET. This is required under subsection 73(2) (notice that a student's FEE-HELP balance must be re-credited).

Procedures as replacement provider

ACBC has a procedure to ensure that a student enrolled in a replacement course with ACBC

- (a) ACBC will grant course credits for parts of the original course successfully completed by the student, as evidenced by a statement of attainment issued by the previous provider, in accordance with the Australian Qualification Framework; and
- (b) ACBC will not charge students tuition fees for a replacement component of the replacement course.
